About the Narberth Parking Study

In September of 2016, the Borough of Narberth hired Nelson\Nygaard to develop a comprehensive Parking Plan for the community. This plan will seek to balance growing demand for parking with the need to preserve the neighborhood character which makes Narberth a great place to work, live, and play.

The parking study team is coordinating with key stakeholders and all interested members of the public to ensure that local needs are heard. This study will evaluate all areas of parking, including public and private parking availability, fees and enforcement strategies, and alternatives to parking such as biking, walking, and taking transit. Narberth's parking study will address:

- Existing areas of low and high parking demand throughout Narberth
- Parking management, time limits, pricing, and enforcement
- Future parking needs
- Managing parking for commuter rail users
- Practical strategies to address growing demand
- Parking technologies such as pre-payment systems and enforcement; and
- Fiscally responsible parking management measures

The initial Open House will serve as a forum for public input. Initial findings will be presented to the public. Potential strategies and solutions will be offered for review at later points in the study. All potential solutions are intended to be as practical, actionable, and cost effective as possible, while taking into account the needs of all of the diverse members of the community. Changes to Narberth's parking will only be successful with support from the local community.
